## RULES FOR "Y" HOCKEY LEAGUES ARE DRAFTED

**Junior and Senior Boys Will  
Play Hockey Games at  
Victoria Park.**

Two hockey leagues have been formed by the local Y. M. C. A. One league will be known as the Tuxis or senior league, while the other will be the Trail Rangers' junior group.

The schedule will be drawn up on Friday, when team entries will close. The games will be played at Victoria Park Rink.

The following are the rules for the two leagues:

A player in the Tuxis League must have been 18 years or under on January 1, 1919.

For Trall Rangers' five of the players of the team must have been 14 years or under January 1, 1919. The two other players on the team must not have been older than 15 years on January 1, 1919.

Each player must have attended 75 per cent of the meetings of the Trail Rangers or Tuxis boys, from October 1 until the end of the playing season.

An entry form to certify to the age of the player must be given to David Allen, secretary of the league, before the first game. If any doubt be expressed by opposing teams as to the age of the player he must produce a birth certificate.

Any team not able to play through lack of players must default the game. An entry fee of \$1.00 will be charged for each team entering the league. This money will be used for purchasing trophies.

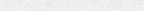
