

LONDON ASSASSINATION AN AGITATOR'S CRIME

Indian Terrorists Are Also Said to Be Menacing the Safety of Lord Morley.

LONDON, July 2.—(Special.)—The Indian student who last night shot and killed Lord Morley, Sir William Bute Curzon Wyllie and Dr. Cawse Lalacca of Shanghai, at the conclusion of a public gathering in the Imperial Institute, was arraigned in the Westminster Police Court this morning and remanded for one week, after being formally charged with wilful murder.

In the dock the prisoner appeared quite unconcerned. He stood with hands in pockets and shook his head negatively when asked if he wished to say anything. Subsequently, however, he said that he had not wilfully killed Dr. Lalacca.

"I saw him advance, and then he caught hold of me; I fired in self-defence," he declared.

This is the first time the methods of the terrorists have been introduced in political agitation in England, and the country has awakened to the fact in an ugly temper. The prisoner, whose age is given as twenty-six, is said to have relatives in good standing in Calcutta.

In the India Office, the murder of Col. Wyllie, who was a political aide de camp to Lord Morley, secretary of state of India, is held to be entirely political, and due to some imaginary grievance against the system of government.

The National Indian Association, under whose auspices the gathering in the Imperial Institute was held, was formed for the purpose of establishing relations between the peoples of Great Britain and India.

The guests numbered some 300, Anglo-Indian officers, office officials and students. The scene was a brilliant one. With the exception of the assassin, everybody was in evening dress. Dhinagari was attired in ordinary morning dress, and wore a turban. The tickets to the function were placed with great care in order that they should get into the hands only of reliable persons.

Scotland Yard recently received information which led to increased activity in investigating the movements and antecedents of certain Indian students here, who, it is alleged, have designs on prominent English officials.

Lord Morley himself for some time past has been under police protection, and when he left London he was attended by Scotland Yard detectives.

Assassin a Hot Agitator. Dhinagari came to London from the Punjab some years ago. He belonged to the advanced section of the Indian Nationalist Party, and he has been taking a course in engineering in London University.

During the commemoration of the Indian Mutiny he attracted attention by wearing a badge inscribed "In memory of the martyrs." Some of his fellow students taunted Dhinagari, who threatened to cut the throat of one of his most active tormentors. He was a hard-working student, but he held very advanced political opinions. He was a frequenter of the India House, the local centre of the Indian agitators.

From statements made by students it appears that Dhinagari and Lord Morley had met once previous to the tragedy. Dhinagari, who is a brother, who is a doctor in Calcutta, hearing of his association with the political extremists of India House, wrote to Lord Morley asking him to try to influence the students. Dhinagari saw Dhinagari, but the interview appears to have only embittered the student, who turned his resentment into a favorable opportunity for revenge.

Excitement in India. A Calcutta despatch to-day says: There is to-day a recurrence of political excitement in Eastern Bengal, and meetings to express sympathy with natives who have been arrested are of almost daily occurrence. Arindho Ghose, one of the most prominent of the Indian agitators, is travelling through the country in the interests of an anti-government campaign. He is preaching that the "Bait of God has gone out of the Indian nation to unite, to be free and to be great."
