Secrets of Success. Alex. Miller, secretary of the Harriman line, speaking of his chief, said: Go west and the prosperous farmer, ranchman, manufacturer and merchant will tell you that Harriman primarily made it possible for each of them to win success.

"Harriman has none of the provincialism of Wall-street, he was tutored there. His success is due to work; he just works, that's all; he doesn't seem to have any method, but he always accomplishes his aim. He is not in any sense a methodical man as you and I understand it; he comes and goes when he pleases. He knows what he wants. That makes it easy for others to execute his orders.

"He maps out his policies of offense and defense like a good general; his orders are issued briefly, concisely, intelligently. If there is a weak spot in their execution he is the first to know and correct it. He is never irascible, never unreasonable, irritable? Yes, at times; but never for long. Shake-ups in the Harriman forces are unheard of. He knows men, knows that every man has some good in him; he gets that good out of him. That's his power and insight. Hence his power with men.

"He is fond of fast horses, but has no time for that fancy; he has a yacht, but cares nothing for sea life. His play is with his children, and he gets more pleasure out of this than anything else."

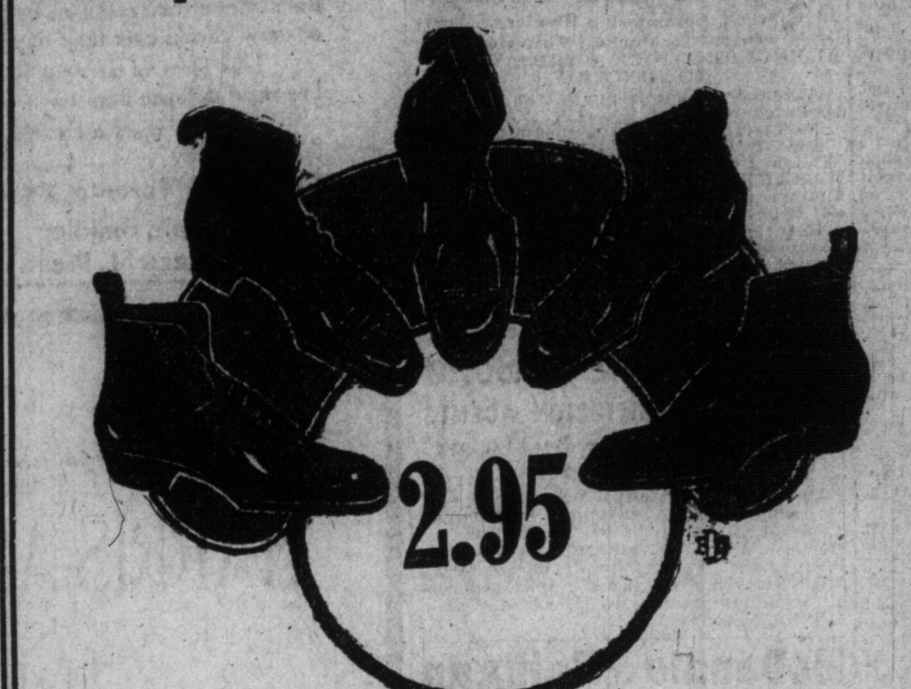
