

SEVENTY-FIFTH ANNUAL MEETING
OF THE
NEW BRUNSWICK
AUXILIARY BIBLE SOCIETY.

THE Seventy-Fifth Annual Meeting of the NEW BRUNSWICK BRITISH AND FOREIGN BIBLE SOCIETY was held in ST. DAVID'S CHURCH, on Thursday Evening, January 10, 1895. The audience was large, every seat in the building being occupied.

Mr. J. E. Irvine, President of the Society, occupied the chair. The meeting was opened by the singing of "Old Hundred," reading of Scripture and prayer by Rev. Dr. Macrae, and singing by a quartette of members of St. David's Choir.

Mr. John E. Irvine, President of the Society, was the first speaker. He said he was sure that on behalf of the Society it gave him much pleasure to welcome such a large audience to celebrate their seventy-fifth anniversary. While they celebrated their seventy-fifth anniversary they were only a branch of a great Society which had disseminated 4,000,000 copies of the Bible throughout the world and spent nearly \$1,000,000 in the cause of Christ during the year. Its work reached to-day almost over the world. Besides the British and Foreign, there were the American, Hibernian, Scotch and other Bible Societies which scattered broadcast the Word of God "which liveth and abideth forever. He had been surprised to learn that there were 17 translations of the Bible in the Dominion, and 15 of these translations were furnished by the British and Foreign
