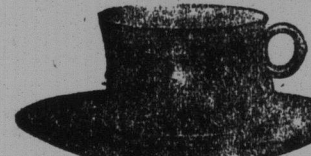

BLIND HERO GIVEN GOOD APPOINTMENT Toronto, Oct. 25.—Lieut. Edwin Baker, B. Sc., who went from Kingston to serve with the Canadian forces, and who lost his sight while directing the repairing of trenches shelled by the enemy, has been given by Sir Adam Beck a position in the department of the Ontario Hydro-Electric Power Commission. Mr. Baker is an engineer. He graduated from Queen's University, Kingston, and specialized on electrical work. His course was brilliant, and it was predicted that in that field he would achieve success. Then came the war and Baker responded to the call. He received the Military Cross from both the British and the French governments, but he lost his eyesight.

He commenced to take a course in stenography for the blind. All the while he was cheerful, and, like Blind Trooper Malloy, gave utterance to the sentiment, "For me the past has no regrets." Sir Adam Beck was glad of the opportunity to avail himself of the services of the young engineer. A youngster who is much given to philosophical reflection recently pronounced this query to his mother: "Mother, if it is true that we are made of dust, how is it that we don't get muddily when we drink?"
