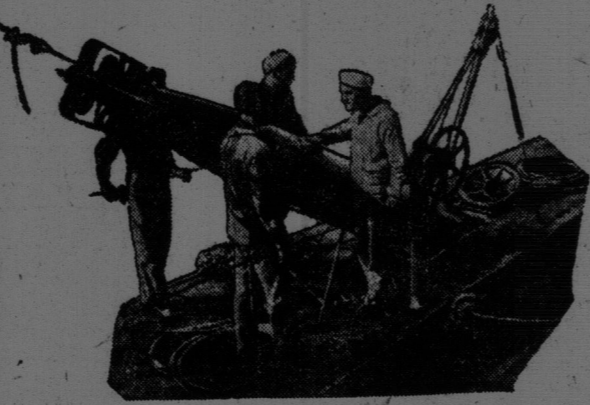

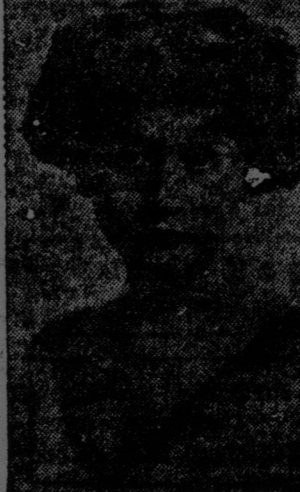

The Red Sox had a hard time nosing out Cleveland, but the victory meant a much desired gain for them. They are now in third place with the White Sox a half game behind.

Washington defeated St. Louis and as a result gained several points. For some possible pennant contenders, but their inconsistent playing has lost the team prestige.

The Tigers trimmed the poor Athletics, but that was expected. How Philadelphia ever won seventeen games is a mystery.

The Giants hit the ball hard and as a result defeated Pittsburgh quite handily.

WORLD'S GREATEST PORT

New York now leads all other ports of the world in commerce, according to a table just published in the Statistical Abstract of the United States for 1915.

The following table, condensed from a more extended one appearing in the Statistical Abstract, shows the imports and exports of the twenty leading ports of the world in the latest available years.

"Bill Donovan's Yankees begin another struggle with the Western teams of the American League at the Polo Grounds this week. The Yankees meet the steadily improving White Sox here on Thursday. Three games will be played with Comiskey's high salaried stars before the rustling Cleveland, with Tris Speaker, visit the Brush Stadium a week from today. Following the Cleveland, who must play six games in four days, come the Browns and Tigers.

The Pitching Staff. "With New York fans behind them, the Yankees surely will put up a desperate fight. As Donovan's pitchers are in tip top condition, the team may assume a commanding lead before another journey to the western cities begins. Caldwell's return to form is particularly encouraging. Donovan is counting on some consistent work by the slim telegraph operator who, at his best, is without a superior. Fisher, too, is in line to win some important games. Morridge, the sterling southpaw, has almost recovered the use of his salary wing. When he is ready to take a regular turn the Yankees' chances will be greatly increased. Then you mustn't forget the wonderful Cullop, also Bob Shawkey and Ray Keating, who has pitched better ball this year than ever before. Donovan's pitchers, therefore, seem to possess sufficient quality to stand off the enemy, so that with some good, clean hitting behind them there should be all kinds of trouble for the western teams."
