

The resolution set forth that whereas women now enjoyed the franchise in Dominion, provin-cial and school elections, and that their interest in local affairs was equally as great, and the need of improvement as great, that the Women's Institutes seek the extension of the franchise to

those women qualified to vote on school matters to enable them to vote in municipal elections. A resolution supporting any and all, neasures taken by the government for measures taken by the government for the improvement of the condition of feeble-minded children was adopted, while the convention by resolution ex-pressed its approval of recent legisla-tion affecting the distribution of the estates of intestates, the maintenance of deserted wives and children, and ille-gitimate children.

LAPOINTE COMMENDED.

Satisfaction was also expressed in the recent statement of Hon. Ernest Lapointe relating to the better care of young people in the penitentiaries. Increase of the provincial grant of 30 cents a day for 100 days a year to 30 cents a day for 100 days a year to \$1 a day per patient was recommended in a resolution touching the care of the tuberculosis poor. More hospital ac-commodation also was recommended, together with the provision for treat-ment of victims of the disease by cities, towns and municipalities. The convention went on record as appreciating the pledges given by the Provincial Government for a fair en-forcement of the prohibition act.
