## Daily Hints For the Cook

**Piccilli**  
One peck green-tomatoes, 2 qts. onions & green peppers, 1 box (1-4 lb) whole spices, 1 lb brown sugar, 3 qts vinegar with salt, let stand over night. Next day drain well. Slice onions. Cut up the peppers and put into a cloth bag with adding the other items and boil two hours. If chopped piccilli is preferred (as I like mine), the tomatoes and onions may be run through a food chopper (fine cutter to be used) before putting to boil. Keep in crocks.

**Quebrida's Tomato Butter**  
Take 3 1-2 pounds of red, ripe, firm tomatoes, 2 pounds of sugar, 1-2 teaspoons of ground ginger and 1 of ground cinnamon and 1 oily skinned lemon. Scald and peel tomatoes, add sugar and spices, cook until thick. Stir often to prevent burning. Wash the lemon, grate the yellow skin, throw away the seeds, then slice the lemon, remove the seeds thoroughly, otherwise it will taste raw. This is delicious. The ginger may be omitted. Double the recipe if you prepare it for winter use.

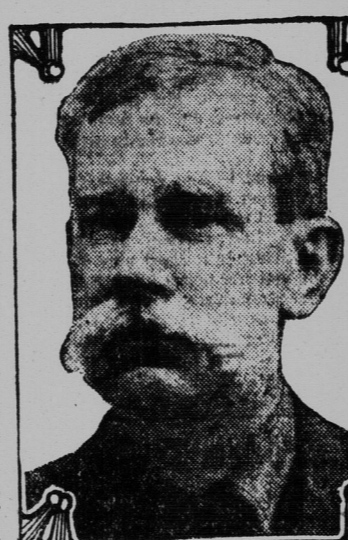
