THE TORRES AND HOME RULE

The Times special cable from London today gives to Canadian readers a message from two great leaders in the Home Rule movement in the United Kingdom.

Zealand, Mr. Carvell pointed out that Hon. George E. Foster will shortly go to Australia to arrange a reciprocity deal under which the very competition complained of would have to be met.

An interesting contribution to the Home Rule discussion is a little book called "Home Rule is a Nutshell," by J. Mac Veagh, M.P., with an introduction by the Right Hon. Winston S. Churchill, M.P.

The value of the exports by the winter steamships to this date is more than \$1,000,000 greater than for the corresponding period last season.

An especially interesting portion of the book at this time is that which deals with the attitude of the Unionist party toward Home Rule less than two years ago.

The Daily Mail said: "Should the conference break up there is hope that the example set by South Africa may once more be followed, and a larger convention be summoned to carry on and complete this work."

"Federalism need not be dismissed in the dark. It is a fair subject for consideration and discussion." The Evening News said that the idea of home rule all round had a great fascination, and added "There is no doubt that if such a policy could be framed by agreement it would afford all advantages for England. Under a just and reasonable system we believe that all the nations and our overseas possessions would have reason to gain, and there are indications that it would be possible to arrive at a solution which would satisfy the Ulster men."

Dr. J. E. Hetherington, who lives in the vicinity and knows the facts about the reconstruction of the Washademoak bridge, says the provincial government is to blame for the collapse of one of the piers.

In a very interesting article on the question "Is rural Ontario making progress?" Mr. Norman P. Lambert submits facts and figures to show that rural Ontario is not in a state of decay.

The average value of the Ontario farm today is \$8,000, as against \$5,000 in 1901. Instead of decay and ruin prevailing, he declares that property abounds as never before, and that the future has still greater things in store.
