OF THE
INCORPORATED SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF HURON

EIGHTEENTH SESSION.

(Being the first under the Synod Act of Incorporation, 1874.)

FIRST DAY.

The Synod met in London, Wednesday, June 23rd, 1875.

Divine Service was held in the Chapter House at 10 o'clock a.m., when the Holy Communion was administered by the Bishop to the Clerical and Lay members of the Synod assembled.

The sermon was preached by the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop of Niagara, from the words, "Occupy till I come."—Luke xix, 13.

The Synod assembled in the Chapter House at half past 2 o'clock p.m.,

The Bishop in the chair.

After the customary prayer, the rolls of the Clergy and Lay Representatives were called by the Secretaries, when 84 Clergymen and 83 Lay Representatives answered to their names. The latter handed in their certificates.

The Bishop appointed the Rev. T. C. DesBarres and Mr. Peter Roe to act with the Secretaries as a Committee to examine the certificates of the Lay Representatives.
