The week end of October 25th, 1942, I got a pass and went to my home in Dorset, Ontario. I took slok with quinzy and did not return to camp when my leave was over, when I felt better again, I was afraid to go back to camp because I had been gone so long. I went to Toronto for a month and then I spent three or four months trapping. In March, 1943 my brother died. During the time I was away from the army I was in uniform most of the time, or else I took my uniform and equipment with me."
