Lieutenant R.J. WEBSTER, H.C.O.C., Officer i/c M.T. Workshop, Coldbrook, N.B., being duly sworn, is examined by the prosecutor. SIXTH WITNESS for the prosecution Will you state please your rank, name and appointment? 0.416 Lieutenant R. J. Webster, Workshop Officer, Ordnance, A.416 M.T. Department. Did you make an examination of Vehicle 50-108? 0.417 Just a minute, Sir, (witness produces paper), yes, I did. A.417 At the time of your examination did you make memoranda 2.418 of the damages you found, in writing? I did. A.418 And have you that writing with you? Q.419 I have. A.419 Could you by referring to that writing state to the Court 9.420 the damages which you found and the estimate or actual cost of repairs? A.420 I can. PROSECUTOR: May the witness use the paper to refresh his memory? PRESIDENT: Permission granted. Will you list to the Court the damages which you found and 0.421 the cost of repairs - actual or estimated, as the case may be? On July 28th, Vehicle 50108, belonging to the 37th Brigade A.421 Group was brought into our shop for repairs. We went out and made an appraisal of it - amount of damage to the vehicle and we found the necessary parts and labour to repair this vehicle amounted to \$96.05. Now, in rechecking this list again I found there is a credit of 79g that can

be deducted from the original bill of \$96.05. Parts
