University Exams. The reports of the N. B. University Matriculation and leaving examinations for July show that 92 candidates took the matriculation and 6 the leaving examinations. Of the matriculation candidates, 47 passed in the first division, thirty-seven in the second, twenty-one in the third, sixteen in the third, conditionally, and seven failed. Of the engineering candidates for matriculation there were four, and two passed in the second division and two in the third, conditionally. The Late Isaac Harris. A large number of Miramichi people particularly of Chatham—bear with regret the death of Mr. Isaac Harris of Montreal, at the age of 71. He was, for a good many years, a valued resident of Chatham, where he did quite an extensive business, both wholesale and retail. He was one of the pioneer commercial travellers of the part of the country between the Miramichi and Gaspé, where he was always welcomed amongst his customers. He was a shrewd man, but his integrity was never questioned, and when he closed his business here and removed with his family to Montreal, about fifteen years ago, there was general regret over his departure. Many of his old neighbors of the Miramichi who have since met him in Montreal have occasion to remember his genial welcome and generous hospitality up to a late year when ill-health caused his withdrawal from business and social activities. He was confined to bed for several weeks before his death, but was in full possession of his mental faculties until within a few hours of it. He leaves two sons and three daughters. One of his sons, Mr. Samuel Harris, of Harris and Barkers, cigar manufacturers, Montreal, was a frequent visitor to Chatham and highly esteemed here and elsewhere. His widow, Mrs. Sarah Harris, is also highly respected.
