



YESTERDAY A

TORONTO, April 2.—Practical methods for the extension of the laymen's missionary movement were adopted by some sections this morning. Presbyterians and Baptists formed a national committee to carry on the work while the Anglicans will open an office in Toronto with an organizing secretary. Their convention also pledged itself to the assistance of the movement. Congregationalists will increase their home mission work by fifty per cent., concentrating attention upon the West. The responsibilities of the Methodist church were discussed, but no practical action has as yet been decided upon. At the conference at the Metropolitan church Bishop Thoburn of India pointed out the great capabilities required of missionaries who were carrying the light of the gospel into India. People there demanded that miracles of healing be performed.


