When to Cut Gats for Fodder.

Any obe of the grains grown upon farms is in its best state for feeding to cattle when it is in full blossom. At this stage of growth any plant contains the most nutriment in the most digestible condition, and thus when cats is grown for fodder the crop is cut just when the plants are passing out of the flowering and the seed is not yet formed. Then the nutritions matter is contained in the woole plant, and it becomes better fitted for feeding than if the greater part of the uncentrated in the grain. To Prevent Hens Eating Eggs.

To prevent hens eating their eggs, a trouble so general during the wintersea-con, and so difficult to cure after the habit is once acq tired, on the Experimental Farm at Brandon the use of dark nests has effectually put a stop to this bad habit.
