The agents of the Hellenic Trans-
atlantic Steam Navigation Co. report
that the steamers of that line have
been released by the Greek govern-
ment and that a regular passenger
and freight service will be resumed
between New York and Mediterranean
ports via ports June 25 and is due to arrive
in New York about July 14.

DRIFTED INTO COLLISION.
Nortfolk, Va., July 5.—Stmr Attual-
ta (Ital), arrived previously from Sa-
vona to load coal, dragged anchor off
Lamberts Point pier 24, drifted into
collision with stmr Trafalgar (Nor),
bending stem and seven bow plates of
latter, owners of which have labelled
former in \$10,000. Recommended by
surveyor that latter proceed to New-
port News and repair.

SCHOONER ASHORE.
Vineyard Haven, Mass., July 5.—Sch
Ernest T. Lee, bound west, with car-
go of lumber, ran ashore on Squash
Meadow Shoal this afternoon, where
she now remains resting easy. Will
probably be floated without serious
damage.

COLLISION AT SEA.
In a crash between the six masted
schooner Addie M. Lawrence, bound
from Boston to Philadelphia, and the
barge Powell in Delaware Bay Thurs-
day morning the schooner had her
port bow crushed and the barge was
also badly damaged, being obliged to
put back to Philadelphia. The col-
lision occurred off Joe Flagger Shoal.

NEW BRUNSWICK PULPWOOD.
Portland, Me., July 5.—Beginning
about the middle of July the Inter-
national Paper Company will have three
boats running here regularly from
Charlton and Dalhousie, N. B., for the
balance of the season. The steamers
Azot, Appenine and O. A. Knudson
and it is expected the importations
will be nearly if not quite as large as
those of last year. The company has
nearly 100,000 cords. Statistics lately
given out by the Canadian Department
of the Interior show that during the
year 1912 nearly 2,000,000 cords of
pulpwood were cut in Canada. Of this
amount 47 per cent. was manufactured
into pulp or paper in Canada while 53
per cent. was exported to the United
States where of wood.

MANCHESTER LINER ON FIRE.
Manchester Liner St. Manchester
Port, Montreal for Manchester, with
general cargo, and a deckload of lum-
ber, put into St. John's Nfld., on
Thursday with coal bunkers on fire.
The bunkers were flooded.

TERMINATED ICE PATROL.
Terminating the ice patrol on the
North Atlantic for the year 1912 by
the United States, the revenue cutter
Miami put into Halifax on Thursday
from sea. Captain Gambell reports
the ocean clear from danger to nav-
igation from ice. From the middle of
June until the Miami's departure from
the danger zone, about twenty-five
liners passing in that section reported
that no bergs of any description were
sighted. The Miami found only three
bergs in all reported during her pres-
ent trip, and those were in the Great
Circle and swiftly disintegrating.

DIED AT SEA.
The Allan Liner Carthagenian, from
Liverpool, arrived at Halifax Thurs-
day with 275 passengers, a very large
portion of whom were in Liverpool by
sea. Her list was made up of six first
24 second and 245 third. The Cartha-
genian had little to report of the voy-
age across. During the trip the death
of a child occurred, the body being
buried at sea.
