Yesterday the S. S. Maresfield

The Season on This Port.
For the 131 days the port has been
open, since November 23rd, there
have been 169 large trans-Atlantic
vessels in the port and seven more
are on the ocean river, sailing for St.
John. The first vessel, which opened
the season, was the R. M. S. Tunis-
ian, and the last mail boat to leave
St. John, which presided, gave judgment
in Captain LeBlanc's favor for the full

German Liner for New York.
London, April 10.—The former
North German Lloyd liner Prinz
Friedrich Wilhelm sailed from Liver-
pool April 9th, with New York as her
destination. The Prinz Friedrich
Wilhelm, 17,000 tons gross, reported
in December, 1916, as running around
near the Danish island of Samsøe,
after breaking through the British
blockade presumably bound for sea on
a raiding expedition. She was after-
wards refitted and taken back to a
German port.

Judgment for Florrie V.
A case that attracted considerable
interest among local shipping men was
concluded in the admiralty court in
Charlottetown last week. On the 8th
of November last the schooner Emelien
Burke, owned and commanded
by Captain Anthony Arsenault, coal
laden for Charlottetown, collided with
the schooner Florrie V., owned and
commanded by Capt. LeBlanc, which
was carrying a cargo of potatoes and
vegetables to North Sydney. The col-
lision took place near Baddeck. Capt.
LeBlanc held that the Emelien's skip-
per was in fault, and sued to recover
\$50 damages and costs of the trial.
Eight witnesses from Cape Breton
gave evidence, after which Judge
Stewart, who presided, gave judgment
in Captain LeBlanc's favor for the full
amount claimed.

**FAVORS PROFIT-
SHARING PLAN**

Shipbuilding Firm of London
Looking for Harmony
Among Men and Company.

London, April 12.—Sir William
Criswell, chairman of the shipbuild-
ing firm of William Gray and com-
pany, has inaugurated at the plant a
profit sharing plan in the hope of
bringing the workers and the com-
pany closer together. It differs from
many other profit sharing plans in
that the total profits accruing from
the operation of the business shall
be divided once each year—80 per
cent. to the company and 20 per cent.
to the employees.

Included in the plan are all of the
4,000 employees, over 21 years of age.
The amount which each employee is to
receive will be figured on the annual
income exclusive of overtime, and will
lose of time to the extent of more
than 12 days a year will be disquali-
fied for a share in the profits of that
year. Allowance will be made for
illness and recognized holidays,
and time lost by reason of a lockout,
or general or district strike is not to
be a bar to participation in the plan.
