

The Grand Southern Railway,

Between St. John and St. Stephen,

AND INTERMEDIATE POINTS IN CHARLOTTE CO.,

Begins at the Station, Union Street, Carleton, Head of Rodney Slip, crosses the Carleton Branch, with which it is connected by switches and sidings, follows along the Bay Shore just outside the Carleton Branch Railway, which it leaves at DeMill's and continues along shore to Sand Cove, where it turns inland and skirts the southerly slope of the Manawagonish Ridge till it reaches—

SPRUCE LAKE, 8 miles, at the foot of the lake of same name, the source of Carleton Water Supply; two miles south is Pisarinco, a thriving fishing village.

PRINCE OF WALES, 13 miles, nearest point to Musquash Harbour.

DUNN'S CROSSING, 15 miles, Custom House for port of Musquash, and site of Dunn's Meat Curing and Packing establishment.

MUSQUASH (sometimes called Lancaster) **STATION**, 17 miles, half way between Musquash and Clinch's Mills P. O. The principal business is done by the two mills on the east and west branches of the Musquash River. About five miles southwest of this station is the partly explored Anthracite Coal Basin, also other mining which have been discovered and partly explored. Excellent fishing is to be had in the lakes and streams that flow into these two rivers.

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
