said, to make such regulations for ascertain-
ing and fixing the price, or sum or sums of
money, to be charged or taken for the car-
riage of any parcel, not exceeding one hun-
dred and twenty pounds weight as aforesaid, 5
upon the said Rail-road; or any part thereof,
as to them shall seem fit and reasonable, and
that the said Company shall, from time to
time, print and stick up, or cause to be prin-
ted and stuck up in their office, and in all 10
and every of the places where the tolls are
to be collected in some conspicuous place
there, a printed board or paper showing
all the tolls payable under this Act, and par-
ticularising the sum or sums of money to be 15
charged or taken for the carriage of such
parcels not exceeding one hundred and
twenty pounds in weight as aforesaid.

XLIII. Provided always, and be it enacted,
That the said Company shall at all times, 20
when thereunto required by Her Majesty's
Deputy Post Master General, the Comman-
der of the Forces, or any person having the
Superintendence or command of any Police
Force, carry Her Majesty's Mails, Her Ma- 25
jesty's Naval or Military Forces or Militia,
and all artillery, ammunition, provisions or
other stores for their use, and all policemen,
constables and others, travelling on Her Ma-
jesty's service, on the said Railway, on such 30
terms and conditions, and under such regu-
lations as the Governor or Person adminis-
tering the Government shall, in Council, ap-
point and declare: Provided always, that any
further enactments which the Legislature of 35
this Province may hereafter deem it expen-
dient to make, with regard to the carriage of
the said Mails or Her Majesty's Forces, and
other persons and articles as aforesaid, or
the rates to be paid for carrying the same, 40
or in any way respecting the use of any Elec-
tric Telegraph, or other service to be ren-
dered by the Company to the Government,
shall not be deemed an infringement of the
privileges intended to be conferred by this 45
Act.
