

or hereafter may be, appointed on the part of the Province of Upper Canada, of and concerning the establishing of regulations for the collection of the Duties, or the payment of Drawbacks, to be imposed or allowed by the Legislature of each Province respectively, on goods, wares and merchandize passing from one Province into the other, and also of and concerning any proportion to be received, or paid, of any duties already imposed, or hereafter to be imposed.

Certain powers granted to the Commissioners.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that it shall and may be lawful for the Commissioners to require returns to be furnished to them by the proper Officers of His Majesty's Customs, and to send for and examine such persons, papers and records as they shall judge necessary for their information in the execution of the powers vested in them by this Act.

Agreement entered into by the Commissioners not to take effect until confirmed by the Legislature of this Province.

III. Provided always, and be it further enacted and declared by the authority aforesaid, that no regulation, provision, matter or thing so proposed, treated, consulted or agreed upon, shall have conclusive force and effect, or be carried into execution until the same shall have been confirmed by the Legislature of this Province.

Commissioners to lay the substance of their conferences before the Legislature.

IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the Commissioners herein above named and appointed, shall, with all convenient speed, lay the substance of their conferences and consultations, with the agreements by them entered into, before His Excellency the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or Person administering the Government of this Province for the time being, and both Houses of the Legislature of this Province.

Continuance of this Act.

V. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that this Act, and the powers and authorities thereby given, shall continue in force until the day of May, One thousand eight hundred and twenty and no longer.
