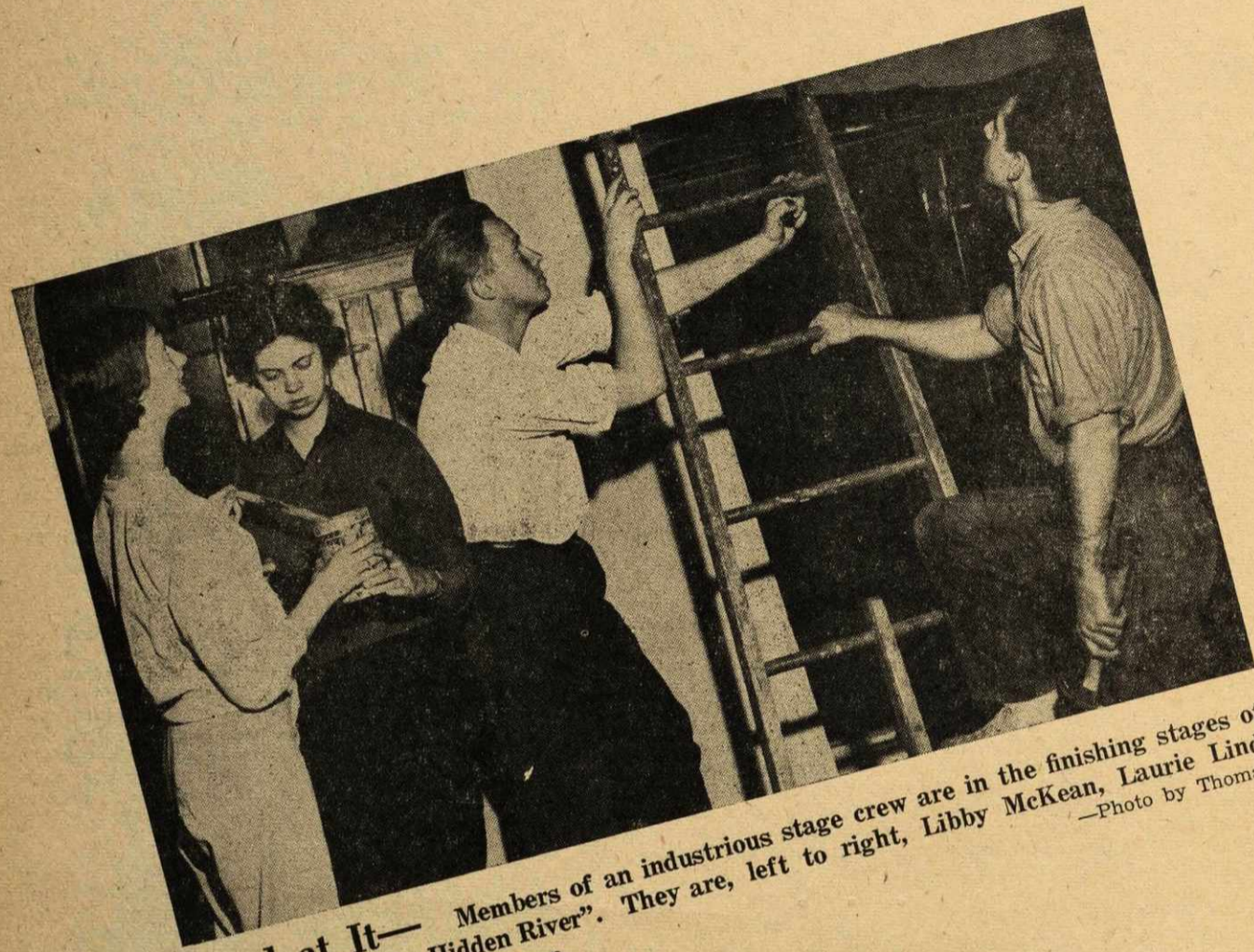


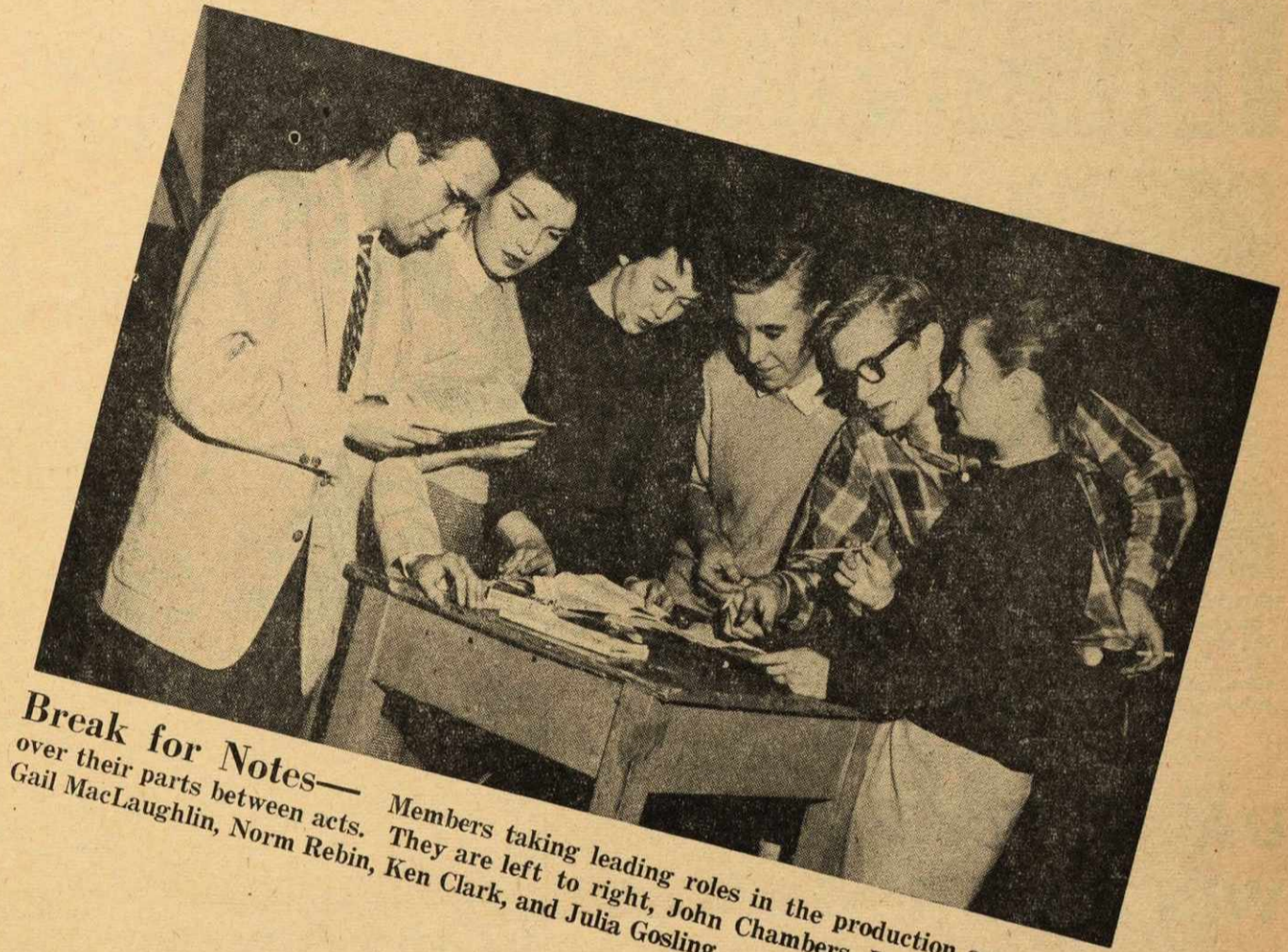

PLAYERS AND PLOT

All the mystery and excitement of a former war district situated on the banks of the Loire River, France, is to be re-enacted by the members of the Dalhousie Glee and Dramatic Society in their first production of the year, "THE HIDDEN RIVER" playing in the Dalhousie Gymnasium, on November 6, 7, and 8.

"The Hidden River," a play by Ruth and Augustus Goetz, is based on a novel written by Storm Jameson. The plot is built around guilt feelings of a family stemming from the betrayal of one of its members. The play opened on Broadway in January 1957.

The mystery drama is under the direction of Julia Gosling, a Senior Arts student, President of the DGDS, and former director of such Dalhousie productions as, "The Admirable Crichton," "The Man Who Came to Dinner," "The Dalhousie Reviews," and assistant director for "Finian's Rainbow."

CAST: Members of the cast form a good cross section of the campus, with most faculties being represented. The lead role of Jean Monnerie is portrayed by Don Aitken, third year Med student, who last year thrilled audiences with his characterizations of the stately butler, in "The Admirable Crichton," and Finian, in "Finian's Rainbow." Jean's uncle, Daniel Monnerie, is played by John Chambers, a third year Arts student. Daniel Monnerie has been sentenced to five years in prison for collaborating with the enemy during the Second World War.

Francis Monnerie, Jean's youngest brother, is engaged to Elizabeth Regnier, the adopted daughter of Marie Regnier. Marie was brought to the Monnerie home to be a substitute mother for Jean and Francis.

The law faculty is represented by our NFCUS exchange student, Norm Rebin, who portrays the

character of Francis Monnerie. Norm hails from the University of Saskatchewan and is welcomed as new talent to the Dalhousie stage. Elizabeth Regnier is played by Penelope Stanbury, an Arts student who has been active in the dramatic field before, having taken part in various French plays in Switzerland.

Marie Regnier's character is portrayed by the Director, Julia Gosling, whose acting ability and talent are well known to Dalhousians.

Ken Clark, who comes to us with the experience of the Queen Elizabeth High School dramatic society behind him plays the role of a young English intelligence officer, Adam, who having been sheltered by the Monnerie family during the resistance movement, pays a return visit.

Father Baussau is played by Leon Cole, Doctor Montalti by Mitch Levine, and Amalie by Margaret Robbins.

The part of Otto von Kettler, Daniel's old friend, who comes to life in one of his dreams as he recalls the happy hours spent with him, is acted by Otto Haenlein.

The stage crew, under the direction of Forbes Langstroth is busy preparing the sets for the play.

Others who are heading groups working for the success of the play are: Property, Marilyn Medjuck; Costumes, Patty Armstrong; Make-Up, Elliot Sutherland; Programs, Wayne Smith; Box-Office, Don Morse, Bill Dickson and Rick Quigley, and Assistant Stage Manager and Prompter, Gail MacLaughlin.

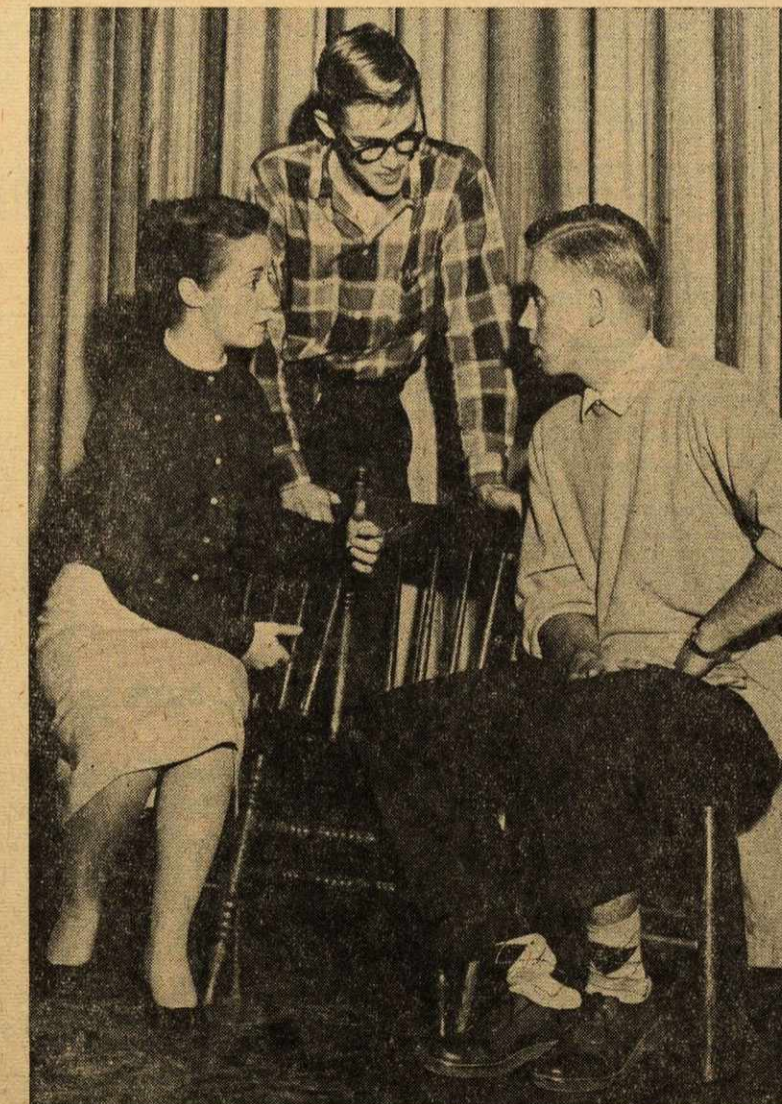
