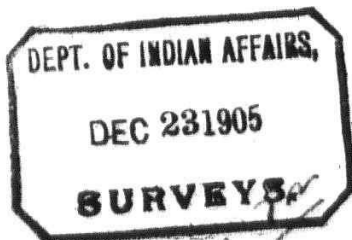

With reference to the letter hereunder from the Deputy Minister of Lands, Mines & Fisheries, Que., I beg to state that the Department has been endeavouring to obtain the reservation now granted at Manouan Lake, Que., since 1898.

Mr. Surveyor Dumais, referred to in Mr. Tache's letter, was employed by this Department last year at Maniwaki. I beg to recommend that Mr. Dumais be instructed to make the survey of the reserve. There are no objections to the instructions being issued by the Department of Lands and Forests as suggested, in fact, that Department may have some special matters to deal with in connection with the survey.
