We have been honourd with yours of the 17th Instant & your mepenger whom we have Detained four days expecting the arrival of the Enchnawage Rondan & Shawmadee Indians with whom we had a Conference yesterday in Relation to this governme. with being ended, We told them to havered feven homos of wanyon from them whereby they Descred to breat w. your governm. wentheyou acknowledge, on that we acquainted them that you are to have a Treaty about this fine with the find engage in the War, and that you had descred us to receive any Mepage they had to Colliver you, that you kindly accept the Testimony of their amily and good affection towards you They would deliver their me bage in wence of tellight Schuyler & not to us wout him alledging that he is your agent, percewing they were not enclind fordeliver their Mepage would him, l'e muit take leave to refer you to him who we doubt not wellby this opportunity acquaint you w. what they came. foray, We hearfuly wish it did lye in our power to ferve you in Relation to this find.
