Camp Borden	7-5-45 (cont'd)		At 1530 hours, Harvard II, 2811 approached the runway at the main aerodrome at too low an airspeed stalled, flicked and crashed causing damage to both wings. F/O Griffiths J 37135, and the student F/S Regimbal J.P. R200066, both escaped injury. The crash was category D5 and the cause of the accident was assessed as pilot error.
