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On to year is th Of the eighty-two international craft organizations operating in Canada, twenty provide benefits in cases of sickness and accidents through their international headquarters. Many of the remaining organizations having Canadian affiliations have benefit features, the administration of which is under the control of the local branches. This is mainly accounted for by the fact that many local unions existed independently prior to their affiliations with the international "central" and some of these "locals" provided for death, sick and other benefits for which a fund has been created. In this manner the benefit features have often become identical with the local branches and their jurisdiction has been recognized.

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In the statements given below, reference is made separately to the benefits paid to labour organizations from their international headquarters and from the local unions.

## SICKNESS BENEFITS PAID BY INTERNATIONAL UNIONS.

In the case of international unions, no separate accounts are kept at international headquarters of the amounts of sick benefits paid to members in Canada and in the United States respectively. Reports received in the Department of Labour from twenty of the international unions operating in Canada with headquarters in the United States, indicate that these bodies disbursed to their members during 1931 sick and accident benefits to a total amount of \$3,472,849, made up as follows:-
