London on January 10th. On the exact procedure to be followed in bringing up this vital matter for consideration by the United Nations Organization, I am unable to say anything at present.

Before leaving Washington on Thursday last,
December 13th, to take part in the meeting in Mescow of the
foreign ministers of the United States, the United Kingdom
and the Soviet Union, the Secretary of State of the United
States announced that he wished to discuss with the Soviet
Government its views on how they would be prepared to
co-operate in the establishment of the Commission and on the
procedure which should be followed. On these questions, we
are in constant consultation with the governments of the
United States and the United Kingdom, the other parties to
the Washington Declaration on Atomic Energy.

President Roosevelt's Vision

While I do not wish, at the moment, to attempt to look too far into the future with respect to proceedings of the United Nations Organization, I am pleased to have this opportunity to speak of the past in reference to the creation of the United Nations Organization itself. I recall very well
