U. S. BITUMINOUS COAL OUTPUT.

The National Coal Association stated last week that the bituminous mines of the country have averaged only 66 per cent. of full time production during the first quarter of 1918. They have produced in that time, according to the official figures of the United States Geological Survey, 132,885,666 tons. The Government's official figures show that during the same period last year the mines produced 134,769,842 tons, and that in the first quarter of 1916 the production was 134,604,213 tons. These figures show the curtailment of production this year as compared with 1917 to have been nearly 2,000,000 tons, and with 1916

to have been nearly 3,000,000 tons. It is clearly apparent that unless a way is found to remove the restrictions now acting as a brake on production the output for 1918 will fall below that of 1917, which was approximately 50,000,000 tons less than the amount needed to meet the nation's war-time needs.
