

Majority of eight in the affirmative.

And the main question, as amended, being put, a division again ensued, which proving the same as the foregoing,

RESOLVED, that this House ought to postpone to a future time, the enquiry into the Rights and Pretensions which this Province may have upon the College of *Quebec* and the Estates dependant thereon.

And then, on motion of Mr. *Dumas*, seconded by Mr. *Craigie*,
The House adjourned.

Wednesday, 23d April, 1800:

A Bill to amend an Ordinance passed in the Twenty-fifth year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Ordinance to regulate the proceedings in the Courts of Civil Judicature, and to establish Trials by Juries in actions of a Commercial nature and personal wrongs to be compensated in damages," was read for the first time.

On motion of Mr. *Bertbelot*, seconded by Mr. *De Rocheblave*,

ORDERED, that the said Bill be read a second time on Friday next.

Mr. *Papineau*, according to order, presented to the House a Bill "For supplying the City of *Montreal* and the parts thereunto adjacent, with water" and the same was received and read for the first time.

On motion of Mr. *Papineau*, seconded by Mr. *Perinault*,

ORDERED, That the said Bill be read a second time on Friday next.

A Bill "To regulate the Rights and Forms of last Wills and Testaments" was read for the second time.
