Majority of eight in the affirmative.

And the main question, as amended, being put, a division again enfued, which proving the same as the foregoing,

RESOLVED, that this House ought to postpone to a suture time, the enquiry into the Rights and Pretentions which this Province may have upon the College of Quebec and the Estate's dependent thereon.

And then, on motion of Mr. Dumas, seconded by Mr. Craigie, The House adjourned.

Wednesday, 23d April, 1800:
