

LIVE STOCK MARKETS. TORONTO.

Receipts of live stock at the City Market as reported by the railways were 70 carloads, composed of 1376 cattle, 520 hogs, 354 sheep and lambs, 105 calves and 8 horses.

The quality of cattle was simply a repetition of what has been coming for some time—a few good and many half fat, and many more positively lean.

Trade was not good at the Junction on Monday, but it was worse here, being slow, with cattle selling at lower prices. Even the best lots of cattle, some of them sold at prices that would not let the drover out, many of them losing from \$25 to \$50 per load, and many more were glad to get what they paid in the country, to say nothing about the loss of freight and time.

Exporters—One load of steers was reported as selling at \$5.12½ per cwt., and export bulls at \$3.75 to \$4.25 per cwt.

Butchers—Geo. Rowntree who bought 800 cattle for the Harris Abattoir Company, gave the following quotations: Picked butchers' and light exporters at \$4.60 to \$5; fair to good at \$4 to \$4.40; light butchers and good cows, \$3.50 to \$3.80; common to fair cows, \$3 to \$3.40; light inferior cows, \$2.50 to \$2.85 per cwt., with trade slow.

Milkers and Springers—About 35 fresh arrivals of milkers and springers of common to medium quality generally met a weak market, as the demand is only for good to choice quality, of which were few. The best cows on sale sold at an average of about \$45 each. Many more sold at \$28 to \$35 each.

Veal Calves—Good calves were scarce and wanted at \$6 to \$7 per cwt. There was a lot of common to medium quality calves that sold at \$3 to \$5 per cwt.

Sheep and Lambs—Export sheep sold at \$4.40 to \$4.75; light yearling ewes and wethers for butcher purposes, \$5 to \$5.25 per cwt; rams \$3.50 to \$4.25 per cwt; lambs of best quality sold at \$7 to \$7.50 per cwt; common to medium, \$5.75 to \$6.50.

Hogs—Mr. Harris quotes selects at \$5.15 per cwt., fed and watered at the market, and \$4.90 for light fats.

A Scotch programme had been arranged to take the form of a literary contest. Mr. Fleming Ballagh and Mr. George McKee were captains, and each therefore were supported by half the members. Mr. John Inglis and Mr. George McKee acted as chairmen of the respective sides and an hour was allowed for each program. All the dialects of Old Scotia, from the Highland to the Lowland were heard in the various readings, recitations, singing, music, etc., given and proved most enjoyable. Mr. Thomas Inglis of Howick, Miss Ritchie of Wroxeter and the President, Mr. Lucas, acted as judges. They reported both sides as doing their part well, but gave the preference to Mr. Ballagh's side. The next meeting is to be an Irish evening under the same arrangement.

Increasing numbers of wolves are appearing in the inhabited parts of Finland. It is said that so many have not been seen since the middle of last century. Passengers from Finland describe the serious depredations caused among the cattle in the districts northward of Koyol on the Kovel line, and even in the daytime the wolves enter the village courtyards and kill the cattle and watchdogs. Recently several persons have been attacked and badly mauled. Wolf hunts have been organized throughout Finland, but so far with no appreciable result in reducing the number of invaders.

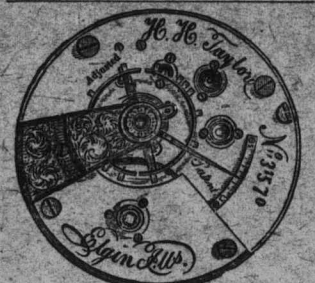

MARCH WEATHER.

Prof. Hicks outlines March weather at considerable length, and we condense his forecasts for the benefit of our readers. March opens with falling barometer, cloudiness and storm. Earthquake shakes may be heard of by telegraph between two or three days before or after noon of the 2nd. Unsettled, stormy weather is likely to continue till the 4th, when look for severe storms of wind and rain, turning into blizzards of sleet and snow in the north from 5th to 9th. This is a Mercury period, and Mercury is the "sleet dog." It is safe to say that rough weather, with stubborn and unseasonable cold may be expected. The annual magnetic and electric crisis falls on the 11th, hence peculiar disturbances in earth and air may be expected for a few days before and after that date. The Mercury disturbance will culminate from 15th to 20th, with full moon on 17th, and moon on celestial equator on 19th. Dangerous storms will visit southern sections, tapering off towards the north into furious storms of rain, sleet and snow. Blizzards and interruption of transportation need surprise no one. Watch the telegraphic news covering a few days before and after 17th for earthquake shocks. It should not surprise anyone in northern sections, if touching 17th, 18th, 19th, one of the worst blockades of the winter occurs. Sharp squalls and gales will be natural centering 22, 23, 24; care for the live stock exposed. Storms will gather again, and reach culmination near the end of the month, say the 30th or 31st, and storms and tidal waves will be probable within 46 hours of midnight on 31st. March will go out with north-westerly gales, and colder weather by April 1st and 2nd.
