Prices closed Nov. 24 to 7-8c net higher. Other grain, too, finished at an advance—corn 2 1/2 to 7-8c and oats 1-4 to 3-5c on provisions the windup was the same as last night to a rise of 12 1/2-2c. Liverpool wheat closed 1/4 to 1/2 lower; 1 1/2 to 3 higher.

THE LATE MRS. LAING

DUNDAS, Nov. 26.—The death occurred yesterday of a much esteemed resident of the town, in the person of Mrs. Eliza Laing, who passed away at noon at her residence on Victoria street in her eightieth year. Mrs. Laing was the widow of the late Rev. Dr. John Laing, who was pastor of the Presbyterian church here for 29 years, and who predeceased her about twelve years. She was the youngest daughter of the late Prof. James Smith, who for a number of years was connected with the old Toronto academy. Her married life was spent in Scarborough, Cobourg and Dundas, she and the late Rev. Dr. Laing having come to Dundas in 1873.

Speaks Out

R. B. Bennett, M.P., Calgary, Addresses His Constituents. [Canadian Press Despatch.] CALGARY, Alb., Nov. 26.—R. B. Bennett, member of parliament for Calgary in his annual address to his constituents last night, declared he would resign his seat in parliament if the government did not build an internal storage elevator in Calgary as announced some time ago and he would refuse to support the Conservative party if Premier Borden's election promise to restore its natural resources to Alberta were not carried out. He said he had voted for Mrs. Mackenzie and Mann \$13,000,000 in order to keep the Canadian Northern Railway out of the hands of a receiver and that if he were convinced that free wheat would add a half cent per bushel to the price received by the farmer he would vote in favor of the elimination of that duty, but that he was not yet convinced of the wisdom of such a policy.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS

ANY PERSON who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 21 years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency for Sub-Agency for the District. Entry may be made at any agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land to each of three years. A homesteader may live within six miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$20.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-empted six months in each of three years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent), and cultivate 50 acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right, and cannot obtain a pre-empted in certain districts, prices \$20.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.
