PARIS BOY SHOT BY A COMPANION WHO DISAPPEARS Willie Knight, Aged 16, Killed by .22 Bullet Through Heart. Paris, May 15.—Willie Knight, the 16-year-old son of Charles Knight, lost his life Saturday evening as the result of a shooting accident. He and a companion were out shooting about 8.30, when in some unaccountable way the .22-calibre rifle they had discharged, the bullet entering Knight's heart. He died almost at once. The other boy came at once to town and notified Mrs. Knight and others of the accident. Since then, however he has disappeared, and cannot be located. Coroner Johnson of Brantford, was called, but after hearing the story, decided that an inquest was not necessary. Willie Knight was a bright and lovable youth and a member of the Salvation Army band.

SEYMOUR H. KNOX OF WOOLWORTH'S DEAD Was Striking Example of Business Success. Buffalo, N. Y., May 17.—Seymour H. Knox, vice-president of the F. W. Woolworth Company, and prominently identified with a score of other business and financial concerns, died here on Sunday. Mr. Knox had been ill for months and his death was not unexpected. Starting life with neither capital nor prospects, Mr. Knox died one of the wealthiest men in the country. He was born at Russell, St. Lawrence county, in 1861. At 17 years of age he worked as a clerk in a country store in Hart, Michigan. From there he went to Reading Pa., where with his cousin, F. W. Woolworth, he opened a five and ten cent store. Although this was not the first store of the kind, it was the start of the great chain of them that in later years extended from coast to coast under the name of the F. W. Woolworth Company. Mr. Knox's trotters and pacers, bred at his stock farm near East Aurora, were frequent winners on the Grand Circuit.

BULL HOTEL, RAMSGATE, IS NOW WRECKED Zeppelin Raid on England is Made Again. Ramsgate, Eng., May 17.—The air craft which dropped about forty bombs here this morning was a Zeppelin. It also flew over Margate, but no news of the extent of the damage done there, if any, has been received. The Zeppelin was first seen somewhere around midnight, but it did not venture over the town until 1.30 this morning, when it dropped a large number of incendiary bombs all over the town. No serious material damage was done, except to the Bull Hotel, which was almost wrecked. The bomb went through the roof and pierced its way to the cellar. Three guests were asleep in the hotel and were injured but it is not believed their hurts are serious. Several fishing smacks in the harbor were damaged by bombs. Fire destroyed another plant making shells at Newcastle, Pa. Rudolph Blankenburg, 70-year-old mayor of Philadelphia, born in Germany, says he is not too old to fight for America. A large catfish caught the hook of Charlie White, 5 year old fisherman at Laurel, Del., and pulled him to his death. Two great iron beams at the Akron Sewage plant was wrecked in a labor dispute organized from Cleveland, O.

Roofing SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS. THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Application must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after carrying homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300. The area of cultivation is subject to re-creation in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions. W. W.
