Considerable Opposition Developing to Pastor-President.

Chicago, July 8.—The contest over the presidency of the Baptist Young People's Union of America grew warmer when the twenty-fifth annual international convention opened for the morning session at Coliseum here yesterday.

The opposition to a pastor-president became more pronounced as the advocates of the lay-president plan in the nominating committee declared a growing conviction that the highest denominational efficiency would be induced only under the executive guidance of the laity.

More than 3,000 delegates to the convention had arrived to-day from virtually every state in the Union and Canada. It is expected that 12,000 delegates will be here to attend the jubilee celebration in the Coliseum Sunday afternoon.
