BASEBALL MOGULS MEET THIS WEEK

Eate of the International Will be Decided To-morrow

MAJORS ALSO TO MEET National Lawn Tennis Association Annual on Friday

New York, Feb. 11.—Several meetings which have a direct and important bearing upon baseball and tennis during the coming season will be held in this city this week.—The International League club owners' meeting on Monday, the owners' League meeting on Tuesday and Wednesday, those of the American League on Thursday, while on Friday occurs the annual meeting of the National Lawn Tennis Association.

Of the four conferences the gathering of the International League holds the greatest uncertainty. Questions to be decided involve the continuation or abandonment of the league for the period of the war; the selection of a successor to President E. G. Barrow, in case it is resolved to operate the league this year, and the curtailment or readjustment of the circuit under the conditions.

President Barrow's resignation, to take effect to-morrow, has been in the hands of the International League club owners since December, when the league voted to reduce his salary from \$7,500 to \$2,500. It is decided to continue with a six club organization and a shorter schedule, the names of Jas. Price and Arthur Irwin have been prominently mentioned for the place.

The adoption of the 1918 schedule and other routine business compose the program of both the National League and American League. It is probable there will be an attempt by the National League to pass a rule curtailing the big cash deals for players which have grown to such proportions this winter as to create dissatisfaction among both players and managers not profiting thereby. Magnates of both leagues will hold either formal or informal conferences relative to the settlement of obligations incurred with Federal League backers at the time of the peace agreement some two years ago. Delegates to the tennis association meeting will vote upon the Executive Committee's recommendation to national and sectional championship play during 1918 and the awarding of the same should the recommendation be adopted, as appears likely.

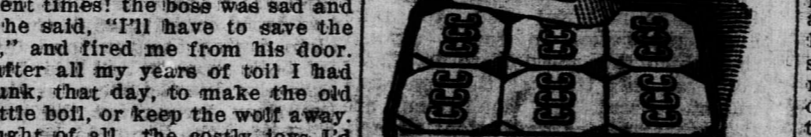
I think there are a great many people who are somewhat pleased in a position such as this girl describes, and for their sake I am going to make whatever answer I can through my column.
