A Liberal cabinet for the second time in the history of the Dominion has been formed. Mr. Laurier has made some changes in the distribution of portfolios among the different provinces.

The Democratic Convention held at Chicago was a notable one. The silver platform was adopted and President Cleveland censured.

The life of the French president, M. Faure, has been attempted for the third time. The last attempt was made on Tuesday.

The move of the British government in strengthening the navy of Great Britain, has met with the disapproval of Mr. Gladstone.

A gigantic monopoly has been formed in free trade England which may be of serious consequence to the entire civilization of the world.

In the international half-race yacht contest the Canadian yacht Glencora has been successful, defeating her rival in two races out of three.

Hon. Jas. Mitchell is mentioned as the successor of Hon. A. G. Blair, as premier of New Brunswick.

The vacancy in the Ontario government caused by the resignation of Premier Mowat, has been filled by the Hon. A. S. Hardy.
