AMATEUR BOXERS IN GOOD BOUTS

Vancouver, Jan. 3.—Vancouver and Victoria boxers broke even in the inter-city tournament tonight, in the Dominion Hall, clever George Ross again winning from Al Davies of Victoria, in a sensational three-round battle, while Scott Cropper, the visiting lightweight, went four rounds to win the decision from Frank Butler, a local boy, who made his first appearance in an inter-city show.

Ross has three victories to his credit over Davies, while the Victoria lad was returned a winner on one occasion. The margin was a slight one tonight and an extra round would probably have been more satisfactory for all hands. The milling was fast and furious with honors about even all the way through. The red paint was prominent on both boys and many hard punches found their mark during the three rounds. Ross had a shade in the first two rounds, but Davies came back strong and in the last round appeared to have the edge.
