POTATOES LEFT TO FREEZE IN CARS

130,000 Bags of Potatoes Said to Be in Cars on Railway Sidings.

Montreal, Nov. 21.—There are in the neighborhood of 300 cars filled with potatoes blocking the terminals of the various railway sidings in Montreal today.

The majority of these cars have been standing with sealed doors for a period from one week to eighteen days, and the consignees have been detting them freeze and are paying demurrage charges daily, rather than unhook them and place them on the market.
