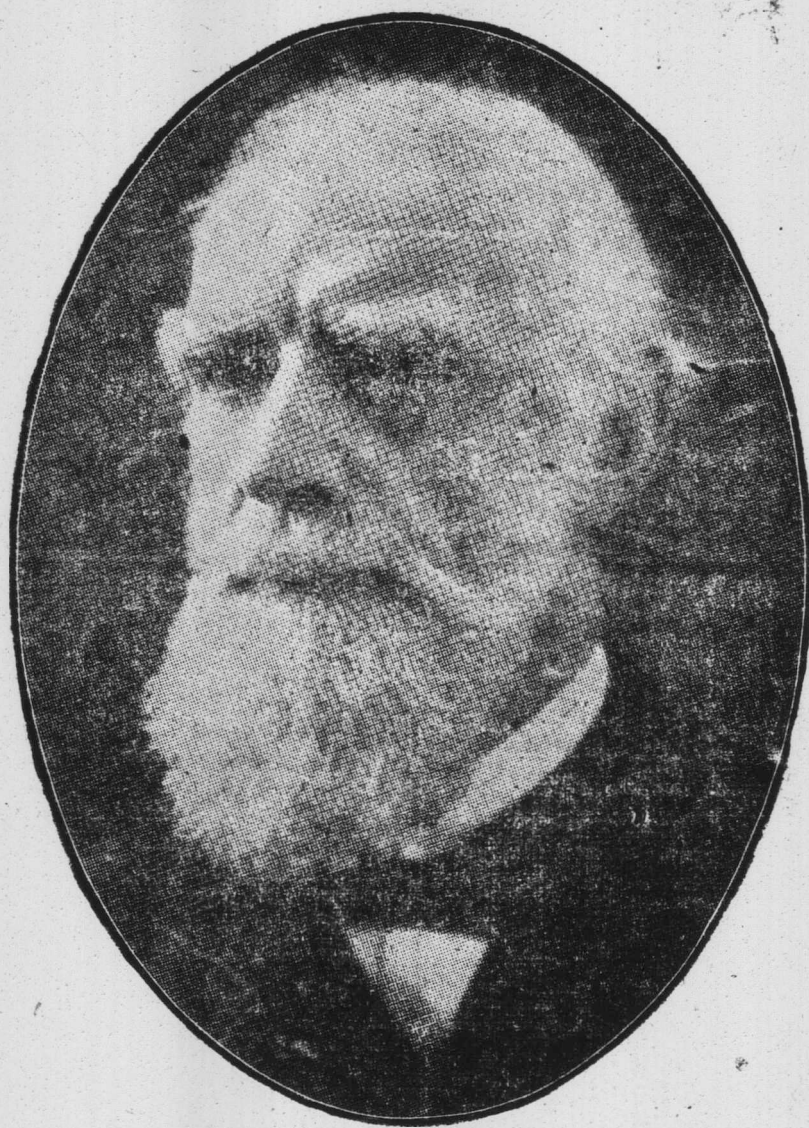

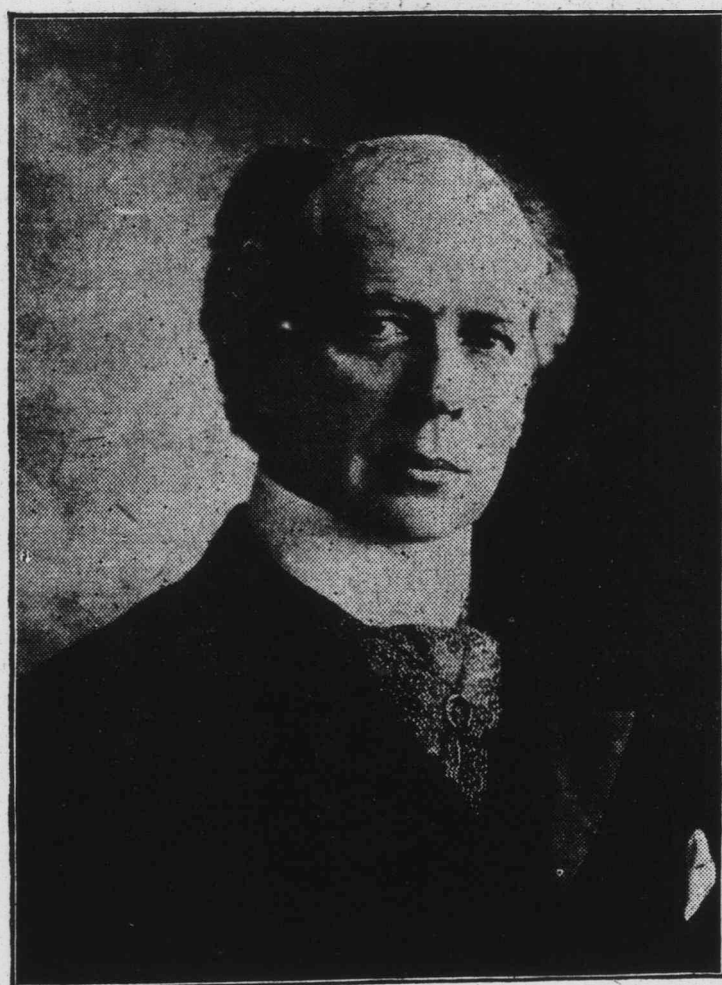
HON. R. W. SCOTT, Secretary of State
