Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations

Any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Three years. A homesteader who lives within five miles of his homestead as a farm of at least 80 acres, fully owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader to good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required a homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$1.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.

LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY Prince Edward Island

38. All petitions for Private Bills must be presented within fourteen days after the commencement of the session exclusive of the day of presentation.

No Private Bill shall be introduced into the House, but upon condition first presented, that

the case at the peril of the signers for such Bill and such petition must be signed by the parties.

A committee will be appointed at the commencement of every Session consisting of five members of whom three shall be quorum, to be denominated, "The Private Bills Committee to whom shall be referred every private Bill, and no proceedings after the first reading shall be had upon such Bill until such Committee has reported thereon to the House.

39. So soon as the Committee has reported any Bill, such Bill together with any amendments that may be suggested by the Committee, shall be printed at the expense of the parties who are printers for such Bill and printed copies thereof delivered to the members before the second reading if deemed necessary by the Committee.

No Bill for the particular interest of any person or persons, Corporation or Corporations or body or bodies of people shall be read a second time until all fees be paid for the same into the hands of the Clerk of the House.

No Bill having for its object the vesting in or conferring upon any person or persons, Municipality or Body Corporate

of any land or lands shall be received or read in the House unless at least for four weeks previous to the first reading a full description of the land in question has been published in the Royal Gazette and one other newspaper in this province of the intention of such person or persons, Municipality or Body Corporate to apply for such Bill.

Three New Archbishops

Ottawa, Dec. 22.—An official lettergram from the Apostolic Delegation, Ottawa, confirms the despatch given out by the Associated Press last week that the Consistorial Congregation at Rome, appointed Mgr. Mathieu, Archbishop of the newly erected Metropolitan See of Regina; Mgr. Sinnott, Archbishop of the newly elected archdiocese of Winnipeg; and Mgr. Belliveau, of the Metropolitan See of St. Boniface.

The archdiocese of Winnipeg is separated from St. Boniface

has been made immediately subject to the Holy See. The new Archbishop has been secretary to the Papal Delegate, Ottawa.

The diocese of Prince Albert becomes suffragan of Regina, and the vacant apostolic of Keewatin becomes suffragan of St. Boniface.

The new Archbishop of Winnipeg hails from Prince Edward Island.

Mgr. Belliveau was born at Mount Carmel, Quebec, in 1870.

Mgr. Mathieu, of Regina, is sixty-two years old, and was born in Quebec. He was created a companion of the Order of St. Michael and St. George in 1901, and was made a Knight of the Legion of Honor in 1902. He is also a member of the board of visitors of the Royal Military College at Kingston. He has been bishop of Regina since 1911.

Of these three archbishops, our readers will be most interested in that of Winnipeg, newly created, because the first incumbent of this new archiepiscopal See is a Prince Edward Islander.

Rt. Rev. Mgr. Sinnott, up to the present Secretary to the Apostolic Delegate for Canada and Newfoundland, resident at Ottawa. The Archbishop elect of Winnipeg

of the Diocese of Charlottetown, the son of our esteemed and venerable friend, Mr. John Sinnott of St. Peter's Harbor. He is now thirty-eight years of age and has been Secretary of the Apostolic Delegation since 1903. He received his education in the public schools and St. Dunstan's College, (which is affiliated with the university of Laval) from which institution he graduated with the degree of B. A. Elected to be sent to the Gregorian College in Rome he spent between four and five years in the study of theology. There he won the title of J. C. D. (Juris canonice doctor) at the age of twenty-two years, the youngest student in the world to earn such a distinction. He was ordained in Rome at the age of twenty-three and returned to his native island where he took a professorship in St. Dunstan's College for two years. In 1903 he became Secretary to the Papal Delegate, Mgr. Sbarretti, and continued in the same office under the new Delegate, Mgr. Stagni. He was laboring in this capacity when his new honors reached him. Mgr. Sinnott is a linguist speaking English, French, Italian and other languages fluently. He is a true democrat and an uncompromising champion of British institutions. With an amiable disposition and sprightly and vivacious to a degree, Mgr. Sinnott has made a host of friends and is a welcome guest at civil or religious functions. In his appointment to the archiepiscopal See of Winnipeg his sterling qualities have been recognized and a great honor has been conferred upon that city and also upon the Diocese of Charlottetown. When he goes west a reception awaits him such as is seldom tendered representatives of religion occupying even more exalted positions in the Church than that to which he has been appointed. His arrival will mark the beginning of a new era of development for the Church in that country. We extend our warmest congratulations.

His masterpieces are "St. Andrew Praying Before His Crucifixion," "St. John Writing His Gospel," and the "Mater Dolorosa."

The chief industry of Bethlehem of Judea is that of mother-of-pearl work. The shells are brought from the Red Sea, and in the hands of native artisans are polished and carved, the largest into elaborate designs, the smaller are cut up for rosaries and crosses. The work is all done by hand, and the methods are amazingly primitive to a spectator from the home of steam and electric power. But the results are extraordinary. The largest shells are carved in scenes from the Birth of Christ, the Ascension in the Garden, and the Crucifixion, and have the general effect of delicate frostwork. Under the magnifying glasses every detail is seen to be perfect in outline and finish. About 150 people make a living by this industry, which is 500 years old.
