CABBYLAW
To raise by way of Loan the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars for the purpose herein mentioned.

WHERAS the Corporation of the United Counties of Huron and Bruce, has resolved to grade, grade and improve certain roads and highways, within the said County of Huron, and the same, within the said County of Huron.

And whereas the said improvement is entirely within the County of Huron, and the expense of making the same to be defrayed by the said County, irrespective of the County of Bruce, who has no share in the same, the said County of Huron, and the rate hereinafter mentioned will be raised solely upon the taxable property within the said County of Huron.

And whereas to carry into effect the said resolution, it will be necessary for the said Corporation to raise the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

And whereas it will require the sum of Three thousand and hundred dollars to be raised annually by the said Corporation for the payment of the said loan and interest as also hereinafter mentioned.

And whereas the amount of the whole taxable property of the said Municipality, irrespective of any future increase of the same, as represented by any income to be derived from the temporary investment of the sinking fund hereinafter mentioned, or any part thereof, being for the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, was eight million, three hundred and ninety-six thousand three hundred and thirty-five dollars.

And whereas for paying the interest and creating an equal annual sinking fund for paying the said sum of Twenty thousand dollars and interest, as hereinafter mentioned, it will require an equal annual special rate of four tenths of a mill in the dollar, in addition to all other taxes and rates to be levied in each year.

Be it therefore enacted by the Corporation of the United Counties of Huron and Bruce: I. That it shall be lawful for the Wardens for the time being of the said last mentioned Corporation, to raise by way of loan, from any person or persons, body or bodies corporate, not exceeding the sum of Twenty thousand dollars, and to cause the same to be paid into the hands of the Treasurer of the United Counties aforesaid, for the purpose and with the object above recited.

II. That it shall be lawful for the said Wardens to cause any number of Debentures to be made, not exceeding the sum of Twenty thousand dollars each, and that the said Debentures shall be sealed with the seal of the said Corporation, and signed by the said Wardens.

III. That the said Debentures shall be made payable in ten years, at such date as the said Wardens may think fit, and that the said Debentures shall be secured by a mortgage on the land in England or some place in Canada, to be designated in the said Debentures, and shall have attached to them coupons for the payment of interest.

IV. That the said Debentures and coupons shall be made out in either Sterling money or Provincial currency of the Province of Ontario, at the option of the said Wardens, and that the whole amount of said Debentures shall not exceed the before mentioned sum of Twenty thousand dollars, and they shall bear interest at and after the rate of six per cent per annum, which interest shall be payable on the first day of January and first day of July in each year during the continuance of the said Debentures, at the place where the Debentures are made payable.

V. That for the purpose of forming a sinking fund, for the payment of the said Debentures, and the interest at the rate aforesaid to become due thereon, an equal special rate of four tenths of a mill in the dollar shall in addition to all other rates and taxes be levied, levied and collected each year solely upon all the taxable property within the said County of Huron, during the continuance of the said Debentures or any of them.

VI. That this By-law shall take effect from and come into operation on the first day of July in our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four.
