The Downey-Gibbs Racket.

The Gibbs Organ Downs Downey.

We publish to-day a letter from Mr. J. F. Downey, M.H.A. for St. George's during the last term of the Assembly. It will be observed that Mr. Downey strongly disapproves of the tone and temper of political discussions in newspapers. Although he strains at a gnat he has no difficulty in swallowing a camel. He was not so very nice about accepting a standing retainer which required a whitewashing act to purge him from a violation of the Placeman's Act.

He holds the opinion that an unwarranted use was made of our columns for the publication of a letter from "Western Shore Man" in the issue of Thursday of last week. Surely Mr. Downey cannot be contending that the advocacy of replacing a People's Party man by a Liberal is an unwarrantable use of the columns of a newspaper supporting the Liberal Party. We can interpret his remarks only as resentment at an attempted usurpation by a People's Party man of the seat Mr. Downey occupied recently. We take it that this is the real intent of Mr. Downey's letter. Rumors have been rife for some time to that effect and we find them borne out by an editorial in the Western Star.

Mr. Downey asks the correspondent for the name of the man seeking to usurp him as a candidate of the People's Party. We can tell him it is town talk, and if it is really an enigma to him, the attack in the editorial columns of the Western Star should resolve his doubts. But we take it that this query is but rhetorical on Mr. Downey's part and that he knows all about it and could make "interesting disclosures" thereon.

LONDON, To-day.
 Anticipating the demand by the Powers for demobilization, Serbia was made on Wednesday, June 11th, and that utterance is a clear and definite indictment of Mr. Downey as a representative for the district which the Western Star sets out to serve especially. Mr. Downey cannot now profess ignorance of the desire of Mr. Gibbs to turn him out of that district. In our next paragraph we quote part of the editorial which impugns Mr. Downey's capacity as representative.

"What about the representative for St. George's? Why is he not manifesting the same zeal, showing the same active public spirit? Does he imagine the large sum expended for cattle, sheep and pigs that are being distributed by him is going to satisfy the desire of the people to be treated in the same manner as those residing in other districts? If he thinks so, then he is laboring under a delusion. The West Coast not alone asks, but demands that its public needs be attended to, and in order that that demand may have force behind it, we must have the right men to champion our cause and press home our rights for increased representation, better roads and bridges, increased steam facilities, and a larger share of the public grants."

The interpretation that will be put on this is that Mr. Gibbs, a member of the Executive Council of Sir Edward Morris, has now come out in the open against Mr. Downey, and has thrown down the gauntlet to Sir Edward Morris that Mr. Downey must go. Moreover, we have been told that Mr. Gibbs declares to his friends that he will go to St. George's, whether or no Mr. Downey is retained as the official candidate. This is only one of the signs of the coming dissolution of the Morris Government, who are fighting among themselves for jobs and patronage before Morris meets his Waterloo, as Napoleon did, 98 years ago. If accounts be true, the picnic to Freshwater a few days ago was not characterized by that peace which passeth understanding. Morris and Crosbie are not cooling doves these days.
