He Has Charge of Over 13,000 Separate Articles at Buckingham Palace.

What are known as the silver pan ries at Buckingham. Palace are in harge of an official known as the Silver Butler, who has six assistants. The silver pantries contain not on-y all the Royal plate but a vast numof other treasures belonging to he King and Queen; consisting of arious presents which have been given their Majesties from time to ime, and of articles their Majesties

ave purchased. There are in all three pantries wo of these are fitted with large glass and polished ebony cases, in ed; underneath the cases are big ony drawers where smaller articles are kept. The third room is the cleaning room, where the plate is

The silver pantries are situated in the basement floor; and two of the

All the valuable contents of the silver pantries are in charge of the silver butler, who is responsible for heir safe-keeping.

Over thirteen thousand articles ounting the spoons and forks as parate articles) are in his charge. hey are catalogued in three separ te books, which are checked twice a ear in January and July.

The silver plate in general use at he Palace consists of a silver dinner service, three silver breakfast services, two silver tea and coffee services, and, in addition, a very large quantity of silver spoons and

And also, the milch goat is practically immune to tuberculosis, while the apparently healthful and herefore unsuspected cow may be, and often is, dangerously tubercu-
