Comparative quietude still prevails on the British front in France and Belgium, and along the French line running from the region of St. Quentin to the Swiss border, except for bombardments and minor infantry operations from the Verdun region to Hartmanns Weilerkoff. In Alsace the artillery activity has been pronounced or various sectors. The situation in Russia continues obscure, although s losing ground in the face of opposition, they being opposed by the Ukranians and followers of General Kaledines. The Bolsheviki commisioners are declared to have declined accept the Rada's offer to the Bolsheviki and to demand that the Ukraine cease aiding Kaledines' for es and give the Rada an opportunity reconsider its action. As indicaing that the Rada has finally declin ed to give heed to the dictates of the Bolsheviki is the report that a definte alliance has been formed between Kaledines' followers and the Ukran ans. A despatch from Petrograd says an unofficial report in circulation in the Russian capital is to the effect that the Germans have rejected the peace terms put forward by Bolsheviki delegates. Recent despatches having indicated that the peace pour parlers in progress at Brest-Litovsk were merely preliminary to the peace conference which is to assemble there next Tuesday and which is to be tended by German and Austro-Hungarian Foreign Ministers.

HUGE FORCES IN ITALY.

With the French Armies in North-

ern Italy, Thursday, Dec. 20 .-- A careful compilation of the strength and isposition of the tremendous Austro-German forces, which was criginally and probably have been augmented by just been completed by the French military authorities. The summary shows that between the middle of November and the middle of Decemper the bulk of the enemy forces have been steadily shifted from the Lower Piave line to the sector between the Vider or Upper Piave and Asiago Plateau, the part that is held by the French, until the forces which are the northern Italian plains have been stronger because of the fact that it ncludes fully seven German divisions known to be engaged against the Al- other stores. ies. "This formidable strength of the invader accounts for the scattered gains that have been recorded during the last fortnight, culminating in the capture on Tuesday of Monte Asolene. These positions are only a few miles from the plain proper and therefore as in the case of the Col-Della-Beretta captured a few days previously, their requisition is a valuable position flanking the other mountains, which still are held stubbornly by the Italians, who, although the enemy is able to control movements to and from the otherwise strategic heights, are gradually relinquishing a few points and falling back on this ector upon a new line. They have made the enemy pay dearly for each yard of ground gained and have put up a determined defence that augurs well for the future, especially since the French are forces behind their battle fronts.
