And that Western women have no monopoly of beautiful thought, expression, and poetic fancy when writing the man they love is proved by the stationery letters of a Chinese lady published in book form by the publisher. These letters were written by the wife of a Chinese governor to her husband while he was accompanying his master, Prince Chung, on his trip round the world.

Well, "sends with each stroke of brush (the Chinese write with a brush) a part of her heart."

Do not thou remember when first I raised my veil and looked long into my eyes? I was thinking, "Will she be beautiful?" and in fear I did look but for a moment, then my fall, and I would not raise them again. But in that moment I that thou wert tall and beautiful, thy skin was clear, and thy teeth pearls. I was secretly glad within heart, because I have known of those who, when they saw their husbands in terror, as they were old and decrepit, I love for these I love thee, O mine, my wife."

Bygone years women have poured their rhapsodies of love in letters and verse.

That love's swain, for example, and wife with more abandon than Augustus Murray in the following words addressed to Augustus.

My sweet, son of George III.—My treasure, my dearest life and how can I refuse you? You shall see me; my whole soul rejoices the assurance of your love. To be in a dream that I cannot make it is a felicity that is beyond my bliss. I am what you will; I will must be mine, and no will ever be dearer to me, more mine, than that of Augustus, my Lord, my

the Duke of Cumberland, Lady Anne wrote:—

My dearest soul, how can I express my feelings of gratitude and love for you? Your dear heart is so with me and feels every emotion I do. How happy will that day be that brings you back! I shall be for very joy. My dearest soul, and you ten thousand kisses."

Among the most beautiful love-letters in our language are those addressed by the Princess Adelaide, the III's youngest daughter, to her husband, Charles Fitzroy.

My dear, my own dear angel, of them runs, "I really must and I glory in our attachment. I pine for my dear Charles more and more every instant. O my precious darling, often do I say, would to God my husband and best friend and companion was here to protect and assure me, as I am sure was destined to be. My dearest angel, I am so of you. I shall go mad if I don't see you soon."

The ill-starred love of Mary Wollcraft for Captain Imlay enriched world with some tender and beautiful letters.

My lips," she writes in one, "are more than signs, and I rest my cheek upon, forgetting all the world. I do not let the hue of love out of picture, the rosy glow; and fancy spread it over my own cheeks, I live; for I feel them burning, while delicious tear trembles in my eyes."

At among all these letters of women who have loved there are none so poignant and passionate as those written by the Russian Empress Elizabeth to Major Ghebot, who had married to her so tenderly in the convent to which her husband's cruelty consigned her, and who had awakened in her a passionate devotion.

My light, my soul, my joy," she wrote in one distracted letter, "has been the hour of departure come at last! O my light, how can I live from thee? Rather would I see thee parted from my body. God knows how dear thou art to me. I do I love thee so much, my adored one, that without thee life is so bleak. Come to me; without thee I die. Do not let me die. Send me a crust of bread thou hast bit from thy tooth, or the wafer of heart often worn, that I may have something to bring thee near to me."

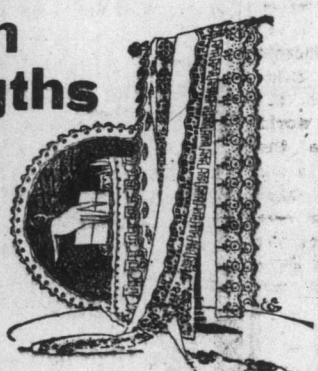

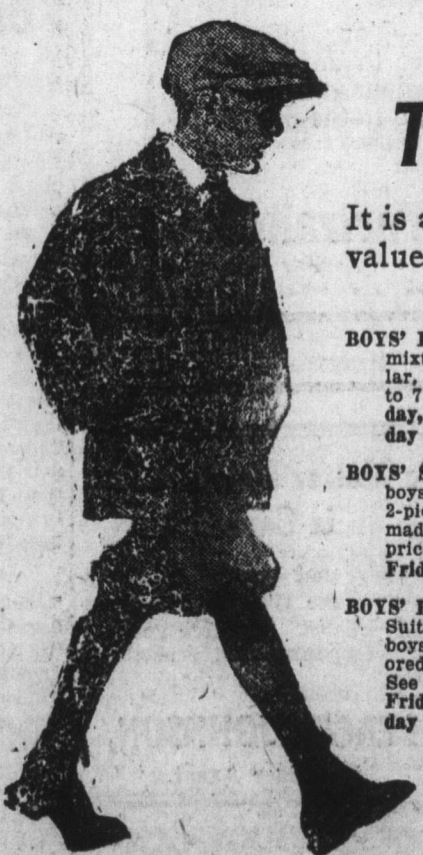
