and Humpbacks Teem
in Bay of WhalesThe wireless tidings via New South
Wales that the steamship Sir James
Clark Ross had succeeded in forcing
her way within the Antarctic into the
Ross Sea gives a spice of real adven-
ture to a whaling expedition which is
now the "big story," interesting and
important because it is commer-
cial in purpose, writes E. Kay Robin-
son, in the London Times.For most of the much hunted whales
of the South Sea have taken refuge
behind the ice barriers of the Antarc-
tic; but, just on the other side of
Ross Sea, in a direct line to the South
Pole, lies the Bay of Whales, where,
when it was last visited, according to
Shackleton's chronicles, "Killers, gar-
ners, and humpbacks were rising and
blowing all round."

To be surrounded by "killers," fin-

ners, and humpbacks rising and blow-
ing" to most of us suggests a ran-
tome nightmare, but it is a welcome
experience to a whaler, for two at
least of them provide huge supplies
of oil and whalebone.The largest, commonest, and best
known of the finners, or fin-whales, is
the rorqual, a huge beast some twenty
yards long, which is occasionally cast
up on the British coast, the hump-
backed whale differing from it chief-
ly in its comparatively larger head and
flippers, and its acrobatic activity on
the surface of the sea. When a crea-
ture is 15 yards in length a little gam-
boling goes a long way.

A voracious brute,

The third of the trio, the terrible
killer—one of which very nearly took
a party of Shackleton's men off an ice
floe—is perhaps better known by its
old name of the grampus.Three half grown specimens, it will
be remembered, came up the Thames
in 1890 and sported for hours between
Battersea and Chelsea, returning to
the open sea under cover of the
night.Compared with the others they have
little value and moderate size, seldom
exceeding seven yards in length, but
they have characters which corre-
spond with their powerful carnivorous
teeth, and roam in packs like huge
ocean wolves, attacking and worrying
to death the little whales.Their voracity is shocking. One
has been seen to catch and swallow
four porpoises in succession, while
another, not a large specimen, had in-
side it when killed no fewer than
fourteen seals which had all been
swallowed whole.So to be surrounded by killers as
well as finners and humpbacks might
well be a nightmare to any but re-
solute and well equipped whalers
like the men in the Sir James Clark
Ross. But the real perils which they
have to face are the Antarctic ice and
the fierce storms for which the Ross
Sea is notorious.Garnish shredded canned pineapple
