

Despatches to the Evening Mercury

The Tribune's special says the cause of the Insurgents in Cuba does not seem to be growing in strength with the administration. It has come to the knowledge of the President, that their only hope of success is in obtaining material aid from the United States Government. It is asserted by pretty high authority, that unless such aid is rendered, the Insurgents will not be able to hold out more than 60 days. It can be stated on the authority of the President and Secretary of State that it is not the intention of our Government to interfere in the affairs of that Island beyond protecting our citizens and their property.

Board of School Trustees.

The Board met last night. Present—Mr. Peterson, chairman, Messrs. Pirie, Kennedy, Newton, Mitchell, Stevenson, Fraser and Innes.

Mr. Newton presented the report of the Finance Committee, recommending the payment of several accounts, which was adopted.

He also brought down the financial estimate of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for the current year:

The estimated expenditure for the Grammar School is \$1417.60, and the receipts including Legislative and County grants &c., \$1277.1eaving \$140 to be provided for by assessment.

For the Common schools, after deduct-ducting the balance on hand from last year \$540.98, the Legislative grant \$400, and the estimated amount realised from leudes the \$140 to be raised for the Grammar School.

The report was received, after which the meeting adjourned.
