

TO THE ELECTORS OF

Gentlemen.—In compliance with the solicitations and requests of a large number of the electors of the Electoral District of East Middlesex, I have again consented to become the Independent candidate for the representation of this riding in the Parliament of Canada, believing as I do, that at no time in the history of our Dominion has there been a greater necessity for independent thought and action than at present. It would, if elected, support a liberal trade policy between Canada and Great Britain, thereby tending to strengthen the bonds of union that exist between the Dominion and the mother land. A tariff for revenue purposes only, is all that should be maintained. I would favor the obtaining by every legitimate effort, of a favorable reciprocity treaty between Canada and the United States. The freest trade relations possible should be consistent with the position we hold as a part of the British Empire. I am opposed to all combinations that advance the value of the necessaries of life to consumers. The freest possible exchange of productions should be brought about between the farmer and the manufacturer. The farmer has a right to obtain the full value of his earnings, and the produce of the country should be carried to the scaboard for a just consideration. The system of granting railway charters requires amending, and attention will have to be paid to protect the public lands should be reserved for actual settlers. Not another acre should be given to railways. While the church is entitled to entire freedom in its own domain. I will oppose the granting to any creed on nationality of privileges not equally enjoyed by all. I believe in complete separation of Church and State, and will defend to the numost the rights and privileges that have been handed down to us by our forefathers. A simpler and less expensive method than the present system of preparing the voters lists is desirable, and the principle of one man one vote and the purity of elections I would heartily support. If elected I will support all go
