Goderich, Ont., Sept. 17.—The Northwestern Fair is open. The number of entries is larger than at any previous exhibition held here, and a number of novelties have been introduced, which are proving attractive. A beautiful aquarium has been erected in the heart of the pavilion, which, with its full streams in play and display of fish, turtles and a live Florida alligator, has been a great point of interest. Stewart, is a pleasing exhibition.

Usefulness.

Toronto, Sept. 17.—The Executive Committee of the Central Farmers' Institute met yesterday. In the absence of N. Awrey, M.P.P., president, the vice-president, Mr. T. Lloyd Jones, Burford, occupied the chair. Prof. Shaw, of the Guelph Experimental Farm, suggested how to make field experiments more useful to farmers. He pointed out that the experiments made at the Guelph College were valuable only to a limited section, and the varied natures of the soils in the different parts of the Province made it impossible that they could be otherwise. For instance, Manchester wheat at the college last year and this year rusted badly and was not worth growing. The remedy Prof. Shaw suggested was that the Government obtain ten acree in three or four parts of the Province, where field experiments could be carried an under the direction of the officers of the Ontario Collego. The results received from the different parts of the Province would be much more reliable and a safer guide to the Ontario farmers generally.
