Have No Policy.

Liquor Men Interview Toronto Conservative M. P.'s.

And Are Told That the Opposition Has No Policy on the License Question!

Toronto, March 12.—A large delegation of Toronto licensed victuallers waited upon Messrs. Marter, Eyerson, Crawford, St. John and Howland, Conservative M. P.'s for the city and county to protest against the license amendment bill.

Mr. Haverson, solicitor for the trade, introduced the delegation. He said the gentlemen he addressed were all members of one political party, and he knew that the party to which they belonged had always been in sympathy with their trade and business. He believed the Opposition in the Legislature favored the liquor trade, and was now friendly to the liquor trade. Mr. Haverson pointed out, in strong terms, the objection of the trade to the advance legislation proposed by the amendment bill.

Mr. Marter said he spoke for himself. His party had not considered the question. So long as the existing system of licensing continued, however, he desired to do what was right, and not restrict simply for the sake of making trouble. They all knew what he would do if he could.

Mr. Howland said the Conservative party in the Legislature were not committed to any line of action. As to the general question his view was that selling liquor had been in the past one of the necessary businesses of life, permitted by the law, respected by the law, and in no way under ban. As to its further restriction, he was not prepared to say anything on that matter just now. Conservatives in Ontario were not bound by Sir John Thompson's views.

The Talk of Old London

Countess of Warwick Injured While Hunting.

The Famine Fund Has Passed the \$2,000,000 Mark.

London, March 12.—The Countess of Warwick, while hunting with the Quorn hounds on Monday, was thrown from her horse and dislocated her elbow. FAMINE FUND OVER \$2,000,000. The famine fund has now reached \$2,125,000. During the week the Queen added \$2,500 to the original, and similar sums have been contributed. Lady William Beresford and her husband contributed \$500 each. Lord and Lady Beresford have gone to Brighton to recuperate.

MARQUIS OF BUTE'S UNIQUE IDEA. The Marquis of Bute has celebrated his silver wedding by giving \$5,000 to the town council of Cardiff, the income to be given to poor girls to assist them to marry. BRILLIANT SOCIETY SEASON IN PROSPECT. The prospects for the coming London season were never so bright as at present. The invasion of foreign nobilities for the diamond jubilee festivities promises to be unusually large. The Hotel Cecil, Claridges, and several private houses have been reserved for the guests. The entertainments will be numerous. A Scott week, in particular, will be unusually gay, and the demand for tickets to the enclosure has already begun.

INTERESTING DOCUMENTS FOUND. Seven boxes filled with documents and memoranda which belonged to the late Lord Randolph Churchill, have just been unearthed in this city in a London bank, furnishing authoritative data for his biography, which have hitherto been lacking.

BIG PRICES FOR MANUSCRIPTS. There was a big attendance at Sotheby's when the autograph manuscripts of Keat's "Endymion" and "Lamia" were sold at auction. The manuscripts were sold, and entirely in the handwriting of the poet. The competition for them was of the keenest description, and they were finally sold for \$4,450 and \$1,250 respectively. The first edition of "The Vicar of Wakefield" fetched \$300, and the celebrated first edition of the Malvern Bible brought \$1,125.
