

WOMAN EQUAL TO EMERGENCY ELECTRIC BOLTS FOR BURGLARS

Plucky Wife of Lighthouse Keeper Saves Husband. The Sudden Death Device of a Wealthy Italian.

BATTLE WITH ICE AND WAVES WINDOWS CHARGED TO KILL

The Man Had Become Helpless Through Cold—She Takes His Place at the Oars. Surrounding House Are Cannon That Can Be Operated by Electric Button.

Burlington, Vt., Jan. 21.—Capt. Frank Guyette, keeper of the Juniper Lighthouse on Lake Champlain, who with his wife was nearly frozen to death in an attempt to reach her early in the week, is greatly recovering.

Juniper light stands out in the lake at some distance from Burlington and is provisioned from this city, trips being made in a rowboat or over the ice.

The lighthouse was not, however, so well provisioned as those ashore believed, and Sunday the captain found that he would either have to make a trip to shore or starve.

Before they had got a quarter of a mile from the island the wind increased in fury, and the man and woman began to suffer from cold.

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New York, Jan. 21.—Death by electricity awaits the burglar who may have the temerity to venture into the home of Giovanni P. Morosini, at Riverdale.

For several years the homes of the millionaires living between Spuyten Duyvil and Riverdale have been a magnet for every passing burglar.

Most of the houses have private watchmen, but in some electricity is relied on to give warning of intruders.

London, Jan. 21.—The bye-election at Gateshead to fill the seat in the House of Commons made vacant by the recent death of Sir Wm. Allan, Advanced Radical, has resulted in victory for John Johnston, Liberal free trader, by a majority of 1,205 votes over Lord Morpeth, Unionist and tariff reformer.

THE PERILS OF SCAFFEL

An English Mountaineer Pitches 250 Feet to His Death.

Keswick, England, Jan. 21.—British mountaineering is getting to be as prolific in fatalities as Alpine climbing.

On Sept. 21, a party of four mountaineers met their death on the face of Scalfell Finnacle, and now another climber, Mr. Alexander Goodall, has fallen near the same spot and been instantly killed.

This side of Scalfell is almost sheer dark rock tumbling to a somber little valley, which is shut in on the north by the height of Lingrind. Up the face of the rock run three gullies, called in lake language "ghylls," which from their difficulty can only be reached by the most experienced climber.

Having reached the summit of Scalfell, he said once when he pressed the belief that the mountain climbing parties of rock climbing are to be found anywhere in the world. One of the three gullies, Sleep Ghyll, was climbed by Mr. Goodall with a party.
